Overview: Understanding The Joint Commission’s Emergency Management (EM) chapter and helping your organization maintain compliance with these standards is beneficial for proper emergency preparation. This program is offered the day before the 2024 Emergency Preparedness Conference and teaches those new to emergency management about the requirements and how to incorporate strategies and develop plans and other strategic initiatives for emergency management preparedness and response.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES - At the end of the program, the participant will be able to:

1. Identify strategies to develop an effective Emergency Management program and how to integrate plans, policies, and procedures within a healthcare system.
2. Discuss strategies and leading practices to improve organizational leadership and committee involvement.
3. Identify strategies for developing and utilizing the HVA preparedness and response.
4. Discuss EM standards and strategies for developing and EOP, communications plan, and resource utilization and management during an emergency or disaster incident.
5. Discuss standards and strategies for developing COOP and utilization of AARs and IPs to improve organizational emergency management.

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
